Reserve Center

The Oriana House Reserve Center is an adult halfway house located in Washington County with the goal to help clients in south eastern Ohio make positive lifestyle changes which will ultimately reduce their likelihood of returning to the criminal justice system. The Oriana House Reserve Center is designed for: felony and limited misdemeanor offenders in need of long term rehabilitative programming; and transitional control and treatment transfer clients referred by the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction and the Adult Parole Authority.

Halfway house clients are required to participate in programming that teaches them to think about living a crime-free life. Oriana House's cognitive behavior therapy is based on the model that your thoughts cause your behaviors, so if you can change the way you think, you can change the way you act. Clients role play

and practice the skills they learn which assist in making this positive change.

Every client is assessed and develops an Individual Program Plan with an assigned caseworker. Clients regularly meet with their caseworker as they work through the program to achieve their goals.

The Oriana House Reserve Center is a 40 bed facility. Male and female areas are separate and each offers dorm-like living with its own common area. Tobacco use is prohibited.

Initial community access is based on the client's Ohio Risk Assessment System (ORAS) score and completion of the first phase of programming. Community access helps clients reconnect with their family and the services available within the community.

Clients typically receive community access privileges after 30 to 75 days.



Facilities offer dorm-like living with a shared common area.

Three program phases: Orientation, Treatment, and Reentry

Phase I Orientation - The Orientation Phase lasts 15-30 days. Some of the goals for this phase include: completing intake assessments and following all recommendations, attending and completing the five orientation group/motivation for success sessions, working with staff to establish the Individual Program Plan, completing 10 hours of facility upkeep and 10 hours of community service, identifying sober support for future family meeting with caseworker, and identifying medical and mental health service providers for wellness care. There are no community access passes during this period. Clients are only permitted to leave the facility for medical, mental health, supervised community service, and programming appointments.

Phase II Treatment - The Treatment Phase lasts 30-90 days. During this phase, participation and attendance in all treatment groups and case management meetings are expected including a family meeting with a caseworker and sober support person.

Substance abuse treatment is provided by licensed chemical dependency treatment counselors at Oriana House's Rigel Recovery Services located next door to the Reserve Center. Individual treatment plans are specific to each participant as he or she begins the recovery process and continues in sobriety. Rigel Recovery Services also offers Medication Assisted Treatment for opioid addiction. Through the use of medication, clients have significantly fewer or no cravings, more days of sobriety, and are less likely to relapse.

Clients can actively begin to job search and establish a budget and fee schedule. Passes for work, treatment, home, outside self-help meetings, outside religious services, community events, and recreation related activities may be earned.

Phase III Reentry - The Reentry Phase lasts 15-80 days. The primary goal in this phase is building resident self-efficacy so that the resident can confidently lead a crime-free lifestyle. Clients continue to take passes which provide increasing opportunities to demonstrate achieved skills while reintegrating into home and community environments. Pass progression is approved by caseworkers.

Drug and alcohol testing are conducted throughout all phases of programming to assist in sobriety.

Services provided may include but are not limited to: assessments, case management using Effective Practices in a Correctional Setting, cognitive behavioral programming, social skills, substance abuse treatment including aftercare, education services, employment services, family programming, crisis counseling, stress and anger management, transition skills, life skills programming, recreation, child support education, religious services, coping skills, 12-step programming, and motivation for success.

FAMILY MEMBERS INVITED TO ATTEND FAMILY MATTERS EDUCATION PROGRAM

At Oriana House we believe that addiction is a disease that affects the entire family. Our Family Matters Education Program is designed to educate, support, and promote healing through specific forums designed with the family member in mind. The Family Matters Education Program is offered free to family members and friends of Oriana House clients affected by addiction. Evening meetings are held weekly.

Admissions, Referrals and Screenings

All referrals to the Oriana House Reserve Center can be made by contacting Oriana House's Admissions Department at 330-535-8116 or by emailing a referral to admissions@orianahouse.org.

All defendants are required to meet eligibility criteria including risk driven admission criteria as outlined in House Bill 86 (HB86) Administrative Rule 5120:1-3-08. HB86 required that the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction adopt rules specifying the class of offender whose degree of felony, community control revocation history, or risk level make the offender suitable for admission to residential community sanctions and for participation in community corrections programs. HB86 also requires the use of a risk assessment tool by all entities including courts, probation departments, adult parole authority, and correctional facilities. The Ohio Risk Assessment System (ORAS) was developed as the assessment tool and an acceptable ORAS score is needed for halfway house placement.

Halfway house clients can be referred by the court and/or supervising officer prior to sentencing for a new case or community control violation hearing and as a condition of Judicial Release. Probation and parole will screen offenders for eligibility and determine risk* using the ORAS.

HOUSE BILL 86 CRITERIA NEEDED FOR HALFWAY HOUSE PLACEMENT:

VERY HIGH & HIGH RISK*: All offenders are eligible

MODERATE RISK*: F3, F2, F1;

F4 or F5 with one of the following: current violation of community control, revocation in last five years, judicial release, sexually oriented offense, domestic violence, failure to pay child support, diagnosed alcohol or drug dependent in the last 12 months, current offense or community control violation that involves use or possession

of alcohol or drugs.

Low Risk*: F2, F1, and all judicial release offenders

NELIGIBILITY: Persons whose mental health or medical condition requires a level of service above what is available at the facility.

Persons unwilling to participate or abide by program rules. Tier III sexual offenders and/or any offenders with

community notification.

Oriana House reserves the right to deny someone for placement due to previous program failure, non compliance, severity of mental health or medical concerns, and non-willingness to participate in programming.

*Risk refers to an offender's risk to recidivate.
