Rigel Recovery Residential Center provides the treatment, support, and resources needed to start a life-long recovery from drug or alcohol addiction. Our experienced, caring staff provide substance abuse counseling in a residential environment that promotes motivation and the awareness of the disease of addiction, along with time and structure to learn recovery and coping skills.

- Staffed 24 hours a day by a treatment team of licensed clinicians and chemical dependency counselor assistants
- Separate residential and treatment areas for men and women
- Low intensity residential services are certified through the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services
- Residents receive an array of clinical services including individual, group, and family therapy and, if appropriate, education on mental health diagnoses
- Medication assisted treatment with Vivitrol™ is available
- Schedules are set from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. with treatment and program activities
- Meditation, painting, music, community service, gardening, yoga, and journaling are some of the structured activities
- Life skills and community reintegration are addressed
- Trauma counseling available
- Specialized treatment groups focus on specific needs or demographics
- Families receive information and support through the affiliated program Family Matters
- Therapeutic drug screenings assist in successful treatment outcomes
- Medicaid accepted
- Services provided by Oriana House, Inc., a nonprofit agency with a 35 year plus history of providing substance abuse treatment programs in Ohio
