The Fannie M. Lewis Community Corrections & Treatment Center (CCTC) serves Cuyahoga County and surrounding communities.

Because 95% of offenders return to their community, comprehensive rehabilitation and reentry services benefit them and the community. Research shows that individuals are significantly less likely to reoffend when they are placed into programs that offer rehabilitation, teach new skills, and focus on successful living.

CCTC programming is evidence-based and designed to help offenders learn to make positive behavioral changes that contribute to safer communities. Services include:

- intensive case management*
- substance abuse treatment*
- employment readiness training and placement*
- mental health services*
- cognitive therapy*
- 12-step programs*
- parenting skills enhancements*

Structured activities assist clients in developing a sense of responsibility and self-sufficiency; facilitate their ability to pay rent, restitution, and taxes; and provide opportunities to establish critical ties to family and community.

CCTC is located at 1829 East 55th Street in Cleveland.

It is operated by Oriana House, Inc.

Community Corrections

The Fannie M. Lewis Community Corrections and Treatment Center (CCTC) is a residential facility that serves Cuyahoga County and surrounding communities with the following programs:

Federal Referrals: CCTC is a Comprehensive Sanction Center for the Federal Bureau of Prisons. CCTC serves federal pre-release clients, federal clients sanctioned by a federal judge, or federal clients sanctioned by their United States probation officer. CCTC also provides pre-trial treatment services to federal defendants.

Halfway House: The Halfway House Program is designed for offenders needing long-term rehabilitative programming of 90 days or longer. Separate areas are maintained for male and female offenders. Release from the facility is permitted only for verified work, education, authorized activities or an earned privilege. The program accepts adult felony offenders from the courts, probation departments, the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, or the Federal Bureau of Prisons. Halfway House facilities are also used for parolees referred from the Adult Parole Authority.

Transitional Control: This program is for offenders who have been deemed eligible by the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction and who are serving the last one to six months of a prison sentence. Placement is intended to reintegrate offenders back into the community.

Cuyahoga County Jail Reduction Program: This program was implemented in 2006 with Oriana House and other licensed halfway house providers in Cuyahoga County to address jail overcrowding. Through this program, offenders who are in jail may be eligible for early release if they complete a treatment program under the supervision of the Cuyahoga County Adult Probation Department.

Electronic Monitoring: Offenders referred to electronic monitoring wear a device that monitors 24/7 to confirm compliance with sentencing restrictions.

Accreditation, Licensing & Certification

In 2010, CCTC earned a three-year reaccreditation from the American Correctional Association (ACA). ACA standards are the national benchmark for the effective operation of correctional systems throughout the United States.

CCTC is licensed by the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction and has a dual certification in Intensive Outpatient (IOP) Treatment and Residential Treatment from the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS).

Programming

Oriana House uses evidence-based "What Works" programming that focuses on reducing recidivism and establishing client accountability. Clients are assessed to identify what services will most likely reduce their risk to reoffend. Case managers then work with clients to help them meet their program goals and make the changes necessary for them to maintain a crime-free lifestyle.

Cognitive Skills: Cognitive skills class addresses the thinking errors that lead to criminal behavior and teaches ways to correct these errors. Clients learn skills that address their specific level of need.

Employment: The employment program is evidence-based with a cognitive behavioral component that includes learning skills through role playing. Classroom sessions focus on employment readiness skills such as resume writing, interviewing techniques, and providing clients with communication tools to converse with potential employers regarding past criminal history.

Drug Testing: CCTC clients are tested for drug and alcohol use upon intake and randomly tested throughout the program.

Chemical Dependency Treatment: An intensive four week, 16-session substance abuse treatment program and a 12-week sobriety maintenance (aftercare) program help clients identify, address, and overcome their addictions.

Giving Back: Restitution, child support payments, and court costs are paid by clients as ordered by the court. Clients also participate in community service.

Fathers Matter: This course focuses on parenthood, responsibilities of fatherhood, and how clients can become and stay involved in their children's lives.

Faith Based: CCTC has partnerships with several faith-based organizations and churches. Non-denominational services are available on a volunteer basis for all clients. Donations from parishioners allow for an on-site clothes closet and library.

Reentry Services

Cleveland Transition Center: This voluntary program provides assistance for housing, employment, education, cognitive skills, and chemical dependency treatment to those returning home from prison. Services are provided in a residential setting with the goal of reducing recidivism and homelessness.

Access to Recovery (ATR): Oriana House continued to coordinate Cuyahoga County's ATR services during the second year of a three year grant program funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). ATR provides vouchers for substance abuse treatment and recovery support services. In 2009, Oriana House also became an intensive outpatient provider for ATR; and the Cuyahoga County ADAMHS Board provided funding for Oriana House to conduct alcohol and drug assessment services for ATR clients.
